INITIAL PROJECT RESOLUTION

(Carolina Eastern-Vail, Inc. Project)

A regular meeting of Auburn Industrial Development Authority was convened on Wednesday, June 16, 2010 at 3:30 p.m.

The following resolution was duly offered and seconded, to wit:

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RESOLUTION OF THE AUBURN INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY (i) ACCEPTING THE APPLICATION OF CAROLINA EASTERN-VAIL, INC. WITH RESPECT TO A CERTAIN PROJECT (AS MORE FULLY DESCRIBED BELOW); (ii) AUTHORIZING A PUBLIC HEARING WITH RESPECT TO THE PROJECT; AND (iii) DESCRIBING THE FORMS OF FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE BEING CONTEMPLATED BY THE AUTHORITY

WHEREAS, the Auburn Industrial Development Authority (the "Authority") is authorized and empowered by the provisions of the Auburn Industrial Development Authority Act, Chapter 915 of the 1969 Laws of New York constituting Title 15 of Article 8 of the Public Authorities Law, Chapter 43-A of the Consolidated Laws of New York, as amended (the "Act"), to promote, develop, encourage and assist in the acquiring, constructing, reconstructing, improving, maintaining, equipping and furnishing of industrial, manufacturing, warehousing, commercial and research facilities, and facilities for use by a federal agency or medical facility, among others, and thereby to advance the job opportunities, health, general prosperity and economic welfare of the people of the City of Auburn and improve their medical care and standard of living; and

WHEREAS, Carolina Eastern-Vail, Inc., for itself or on behalf of an entity to be formed (the "Company"), has requested the Authority's assistance with a certain project (the "Project") consisting of the acquisition of approximately 7.726 acres of land located at 53 Columbus Street (the "Land") improved with 4 buildings totaling approximately 36,040 square feet in size (the "Buildings") and the installation of certain equipment therein for use as a production and storage facility for fertilizers (the "Equipment", and collectively with the Land and the Buildings, the "Facility"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 2302 of the Act, the Authority desires to adopt a resolution describing the Project and the financial assistance that the Authority is contemplating with respect to the Project; and

WHEREAS, it is contemplated that the Authority will hold a public hearing and (i) negotiate an agent agreement (the "Agent Agreement") whereby the Authority will designate the Company as its agent for the purpose of acquiring, renovating and equipping the Project (the "Agent Agreement"), (ii) negotiate and enter into a lease agreement (the "Lease Agreement"), leaseback agreement (the "Leaseback Agreement") and payment-in-lieu-of-tax agreement (the

"PILOT Agreement") with the Company, (iii) take title to or retain a leasehold interest in the Facility (once the Lease Agreement, Leaseback Agreement and PILOT Agreement have been negotiated), and (iv) provide financial assistance (the "Financial Assistance") to the Company in the form of (a) a sales and use tax exemption for purchases and rentals related to the acquisition, construction and equipping of the Project, and (b) a partial real property tax abatement through the PILOT Agreement; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 2307 of the Act, prior to the Authority providing any Financial Assistance to any project, the Authority, among other things, must hold a public hearing with respect to the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MEMBERS OF THE AUTHORITY AS FOLLOWS:

- <u>Section 1</u>. The Company has presented an application in a form acceptable to the Authority. Based upon the representations made by the Company to the Authority in the Company's application, the Authority hereby finds and determines that:
- (A) By virtue of the Act, the Authority has been vested with all powers necessary and convenient to carry out and effectuate the purposes and provisions of the Act and to exercise all powers granted to it under the Act; and
- (B) The Authority has the authority to take the actions contemplated herein under the Act; and
- (C) The action to be taken by the Authority will further the purposes of the Authority under the Act by increasing employment opportunities in the City of Auburn, preventing economic deterioration and otherwise furthering the purposes of the Authority as set forth in the Act; and
- (D) The Project will not result in the removal of a civic, commercial, industrial, or manufacturing plant of the Company or any other proposed occupant of the Project from one area of the State of New York (the "State") to another area of the State or result in the abandonment of one or more plants or facilities of the Company or any other proposed occupant of the Project located within the State; and the Authority hereby finds that, based on the Company's application, to the extent occupants are relocating from one plant or facility to another, the Project is reasonably necessary to discourage the Project occupants from removing such other plant or facility to a location outside the State and/or is reasonably necessary to preserve the competitive position of the Project occupants in their respective industries.
- Section 2. The proposed financial assistance being contemplated by the Issuer includes (i) an exemption from all state and local sales and use taxes with respect to the qualifying personal property included in or incorporated into the Facility or used in the acquisition, construction, renovation or equipping of the Facility; and (ii) an abatement or exemption from real property taxes levied against the Facility pursuant to a PILOT Agreement to be negotiated.

Section 3. The Chairman, Vice Chairman and/or the Chief Executive Officer of the Authority are hereby authorized, on behalf of the Authority, to cause the issuance of a public hearing, hold a public hearing in compliance with the Act and negotiate (but not execute or deliver) the terms of (A) an Agent Agreement, whereby the Authority appoints the Company as its agent to undertake the Project, (B) a Lease Agreement whereby the Company leases the Facility to the Authority, (C) a related Leaseback Agreement conveying the Facility back to the Company, (D) a PILOT Agreement, whereby the Company agrees to make certain payments-in-lieu-of real property taxes and (E) related documents; provided (i) the rental payments under the Leaseback Agreement include payments of all costs incurred by the Authority arising out of or related to the Project and indemnification of the Authority by the Company for actions taken by the Company and/or claims arising out of or related to the Project; and (ii) the terms of the PILOT Agreement is consistent with the Authority's Uniform Tax Exemption Policy or if there is a deviation from such policy that sufficient grounds are stated for such deviation as set forth in Section 2315 of the Act.

Section 4. The Authority is hereby authorized to schedule, notice and conduct a public hearing with respect to the Project in compliance with the Act and comply with the applicable provisions of the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act prior to the providing of financial assistance.

Section 5. The officers, employees and agents of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed for and in the name and on behalf of the Authority to do all acts and things required and to execute and deliver all such certificates, instruments and documents, to pay all such fees, charges and expenses and to do all such further acts and things as may be necessary or, in the opinion of the officer, employee or agent acting, desirable and proper to effect the purposes of the foregoing resolutions and to cause compliance by the Authority with all of the terms, covenants and provisions of the documents executed for and on behalf of the Authority.

Section 6. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.
